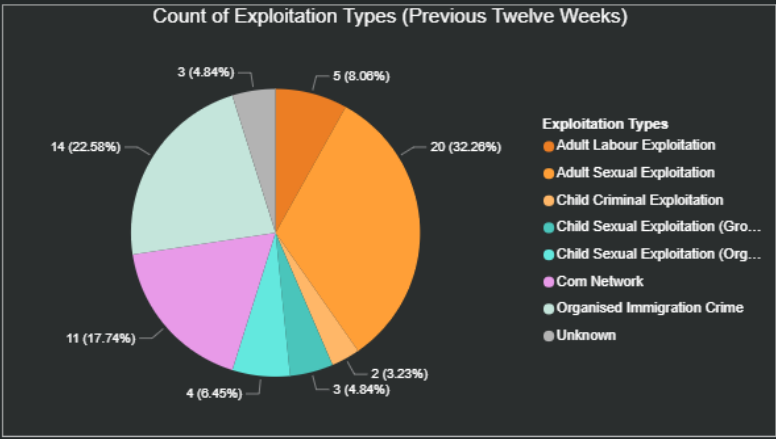

Threat Types – Q1



Three quarters (75%, n. 64) of TOEX's 85 2026-27 Q1 Workload Tracker taskings relate to VAWG offences (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking, Child Sexual Abuse/Exploitation and Com Networks)

Adult Sexual Exploitation accounts for the largest proportion of allocations in 2026-27 Q1 at 32% (n. 20)

Com Networks are the fastest growing threat area across the network. 11 operations relating to Com Networks were allocated in 2026-27 Q1, accounting for almost half of the total number of allocations under this threat type (n. 23)

SEROCU Op 68 was initiated following visits to an address where it was believed sex workers were operating. On a number of occasions women were found within who were suspected of being engaged in adult sex work. These women were spoken to, and concerns were raised for their safety and the manner in which they had come to be at the address.

In 2026-27 Q1, TOEX intelligence development led to:

- Eight safeguarding visits conducted across five different Force areas leading to multiple individuals being safeguarded.
- The arrest of twelve individuals, including the two main subjects, for a variety of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking and Immigration offences.
- Information being shared with Home Office Visa Case Officers who rejected the Visa application of an individual suspected to be involved in exploitation.
- 189 active Adult Sex Work adverts linked to potential exploitation were removed from an ASW.

SWROCU Op 66 is a collaborative technical project between SWROCU and NERSOU TOEX teams aiming to identify users of online chat rooms who pose a risk of, or are, committing child sexual abuse and exploitation (CSAE) offences, for onward development by online investigation teams.

In 2026-27 Q1, TOEX intelligence development led to:

- The arrest of two individuals by Australian Federal Police for the possession, production and distribution of Child Sexual Abuse Materials.
- The arrest of four individuals across three Force areas in England and Wales for Child Sexual Abuse offences.
- Two vulnerable children identified and safeguarded.

"I would not have been able to achieve the results we have obtained without the guidance, analysis or research which came from TOEX, especially in the timeline to which they have turned this around. We have gone from identifying a potential suspect to sentencing in 6 months. The levels of detail in the investigation from TOEX, from phone downloads, financial data, ANPR work, call data etc is something that would have taken myself in CORE CID well over 18 months to complete, which no doubt would have resulted in many more vulnerable victims being exploited across the UK."

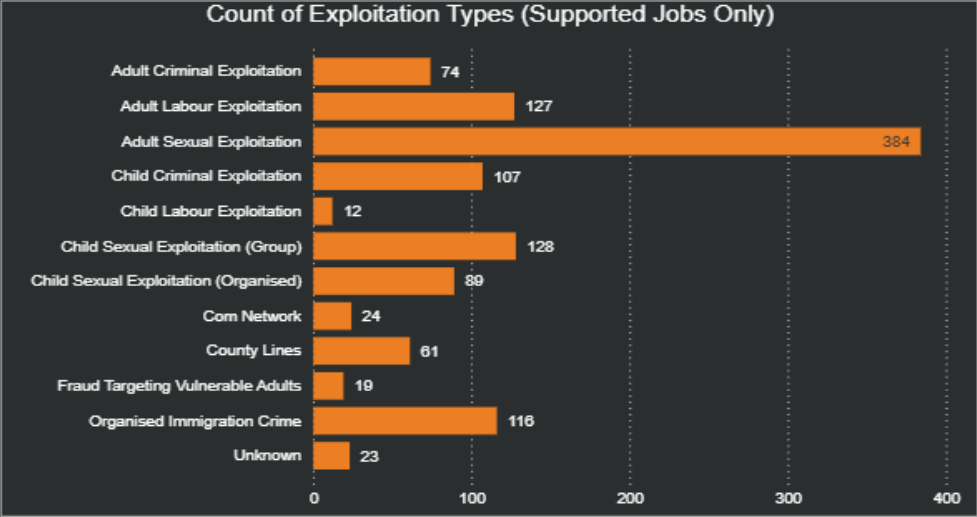
